Speaking of Storengy UK's achievement, the judging panel said, "the winner has achieved a publicly recognised excellent safety performance led by senior management and supported by comprehensive policies and procedures in its gas storage project."

Stublach Construction Progress

Construction works associated with the first phase of the project are almost complete. As you can see from the photograph below, the Solution Mining Compound including the degassing tank and the pumphouse are completed.

The 10 well-sites have been fully prepared and are undergoing initial commissioning tests.

A major milestone will be reached in October when solution mining of the first 10 cavities begins.

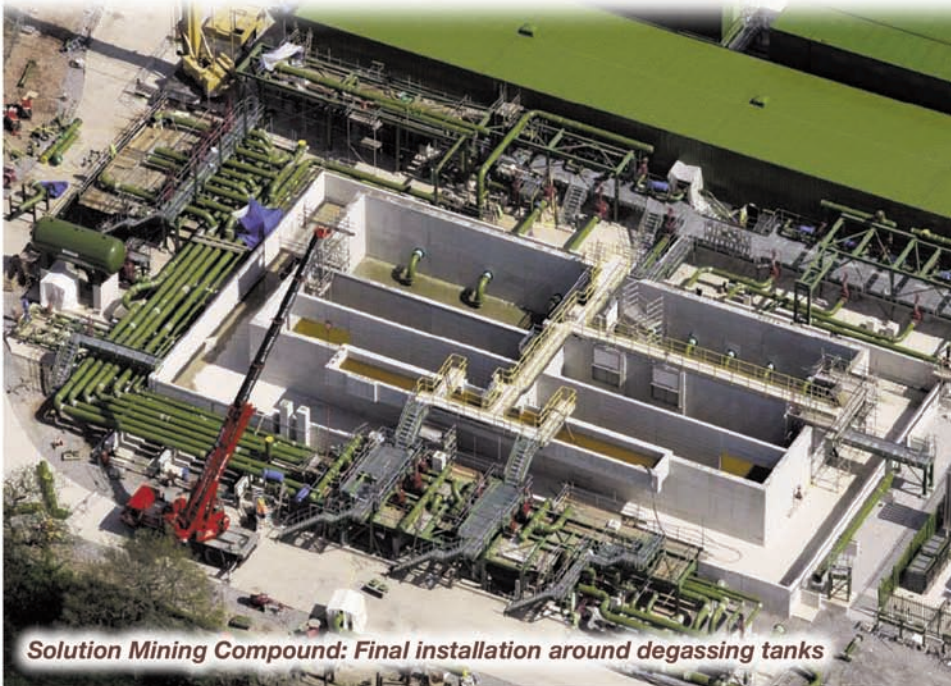


Wellhead Platform

Having handed over the first phase equipment to the Commissioning Team, the Construction Team is now concentrating their efforts on starting the second phase of work which includes extending the road network on the site and development of the next 10 well-sites.

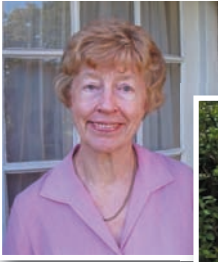
Stoerengy received an overwhelming response to their advertisement for Process Operators and in May, recruited 6 operators from the local area to man the site 24 hours a day.

The operators are at present undergoing a detailed training programme which has included visits to similar sites in France and Germany to familiarise themselves with the operating practices for both the solution mining and gas storage

In this edition, we take a closer look at one of the projects that was successfully granted a donation from the Storengy Environmental Fund in June 2008.
