

Major Accident Prevention Policy (MAPP) Statement

Storengy UK Ltd recognises the potential for major accidents to occur from its operations and is committed to providing a high level of protection to its employees, contractors, visitors, local community, and the environment.

Guiding Principles:

Storengy UK Ltd believes that all major accidents are preventable and is committed to carrying out regular reviews of its operations for major hazard potential and to seek improvements to achieve this objective.

Accountability for the provision of a safe and healthy working environment through active leadership, robust procedures and instructions, effective training programmes and good communications is cascaded through all levels of management.

Storengy UK Ltd will ensure that there no major accidents by:

1. Ensuring that an effective organisation exists for the management of major hazards and that the responsibilities for the management of major hazards are clearly defined. This will be delivered through the selection of competent personnel who are regularly trained in the management of major hazards. The participation, co-operation, and communication between all levels of the organisation, including contractors will be actively encouraged to drive a culture of continuous improvement in safety performance.
2. Providing and maintaining an Integrated Management System (IMS) for implementing the MAPP which will seek to identify hazards and mitigate their effects.
3. Defining arrangements for systematically identifying and evaluating the major hazards arising at all stages in the life cycle of the plant, including construction, commissioning, normal and abnormal operations, shutdowns and decommissioning with the aim of ensuring major hazard risks are assessed and reduced to as low as is reasonably practicable.
4. Adopting documented procedures and instructions for the safe operation and maintenance of plant, processes, and equipment at all times throughout the operating life of the facility.
5. Identifying hazards in the design of new installations and the control of modifications to existing equipment, processes will be maintained with the aim of ensuring major hazard risks are as low as is reasonably practicable.
6. Identifying foreseeable emergencies by systematic analysis to prepare, test and periodically review emergency plans involving measures of protection, alert and intervention which are designed to minimise the effects of any major accident (including potential domino effects). Training staff in emergency procedures and participation in exercises.
7. Safety and environmental performance will be continually monitored to assess compliance with the objectives set out in the MAPP and the SMS. This will include active and reactive monitoring together with auditing to identify and then implement improvement actions in a planned approach to deliver continuous improvement.
8. A formal periodic review of the MAPP Statement and the effectiveness and suitability of the IMS shall be carried out by the Management Team.
